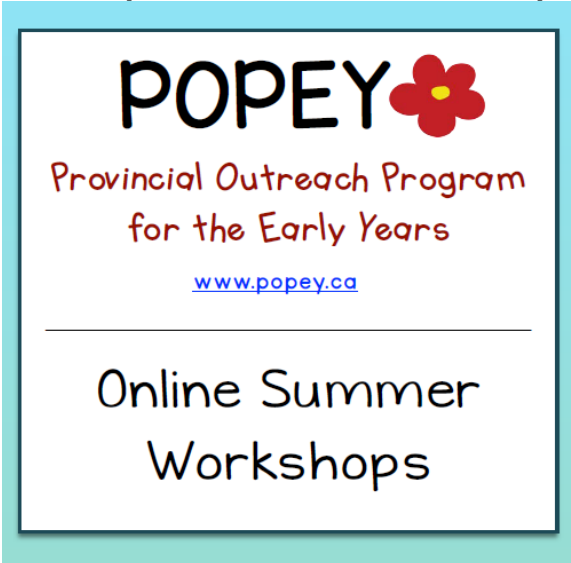

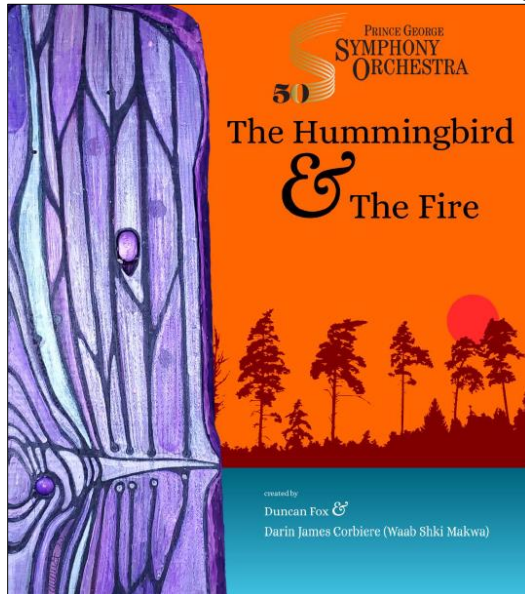

A collaboration between artist and storyteller Darin Corbiere (Waab Shki Makwa) and the PG Symphony Orchestra for you and your class to enjoy. It is the story of how the hummingbird got its beautiful colours.

This is free to our district schools for one year.

Video is 45 minutes, but it is broken into sections: Acknowledgement, Introduction, Get to Know the Instruments, and then the actual performance starts at 23 minutes.

From the program: “This performance is an adaptation of a story told by the Quechua people of the Andes mountains. The story has spread over the centuries as far as Canada and India. This version of the story is a new one, as told by Anishinaabe artist Waab Shki Makwa. The music was written in the late 19th Century by the Bohemian Jewish composer Gustav Mahler, who was heavily influenced by the forests of his home. His music was selected and arranged for chamber orchestra by Duncan Fox. This performance was made possible through financial support from the City of Prince George and the Prince George Community Foundation.”

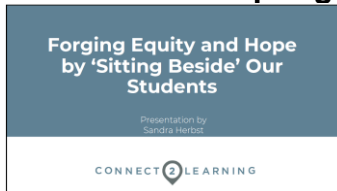
STEAM Expo is June 13 to June 24, and there are several wonderful opportunities for you and your students.
