Session description from Jo Chrona: As we respond to the Declarations on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the TRC Calls to Action, and the newest (9th) Professional Standard for BC Teaching Certificate Holders, we continue to lean into in challenging conversations about systemic racism and inequity in our education systems. 


At Vanier Hall: April 25-27th, in evenings starting at 7:00pm


