Session 6: Jo Chrona: Wayi Wah! Building a Stronger Education System: Intersections Between Indigenous Education and Anti-Racism

Session description from Jo Chrona: As we respond to the Declarations on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, the TRC Calls to Action, and the newest (9th) Professional Standard for BC Teaching Certificate Holders, we continue to lean into in challenging conversations about systemic racism and inequity in our education systems. In this session I invite folks to explore:

- the intersections between Indigenous education and anti-racism work
- what it means to be anti-racist and work for equity
- what it can mean to move from fear to learning to growth in anti-racism in Canada, and BC specifically
- how we can understand the roles of bias and privilege in our work, and in whose voices we respond to
- how we can use our spheres of influence to create change.

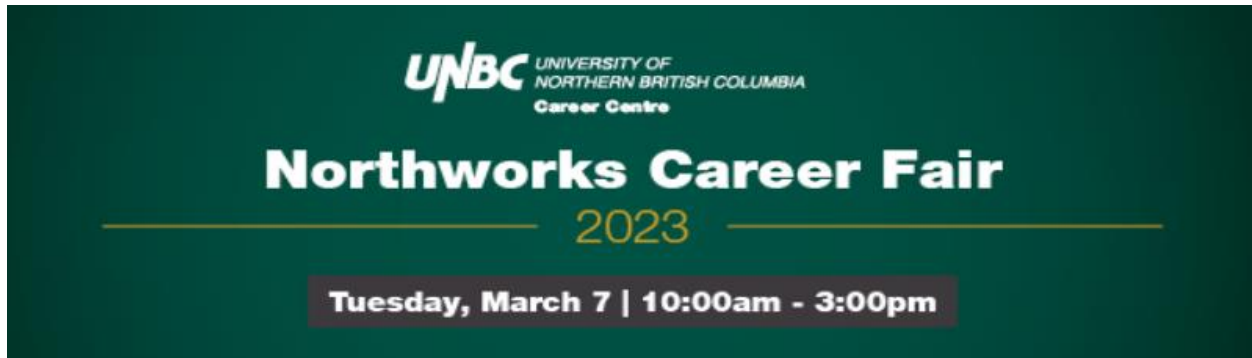

As a celebration of Canadian Heritage, students participate in a one-day Fair held at the downtown Prince George Civic Centre which features judging and heritage activities. It showcases outstanding projects for our community as friends and family are invited to an awards ceremony. Three of the top students are then given the opportunity to attend the Provincial Fair.

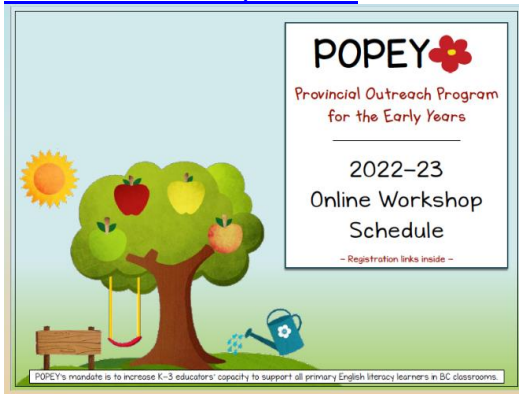

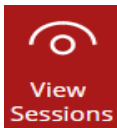
